Results of a Neurodiversity Screening	<p>We may recommend a Standard Adjustments Plan for you.</p> <p>To access further support, you will need to provide further diagnostic evidence from a suitably qualified professional.</p>	No
<p>A letter or other document from your school, college, or previous university detailing previous exam arrangements. This could include a JCQ 'Access Arrangement' form (a 'Form 8') or an EHCP report.</p>	<p>We may recommend a Standard Adjustments Plan for you.</p> <p>To access further support, you will need to provide further diagnostic evidence from a suitably qualified professional.</p>	No
<p>A psychological assessment report completed by an Educational Psychologist or specialist teacher (with an active Assessment Practicing Certificate – APC) which confirms a diagnosis of a specific learning difficulty, e.g. dyslexia.</p>	<p>We may recommend an individual Student Support Plan for you.</p>	<p>These documents are usually accepted for DSA.</p>

A completed DSA 1 form (Disability Evidence Form)	We may recommend an individual Student Support Plan for you.	Yes

A letter from GP, consultant or other medical professional	We may recommend an individual Student Support Plan for you.	Yes
Diagnostic report from a registered medical professional	We may recommend an individual Student Support Plan for you.	Yes
